Answer the questions prompted by the application form clearly and concisely. **Be sure to include the proposal cover sheet with accurate contact information.**

Proposal writing instructions:

- 1. Write in first person, present tense.
- 2. Follow conventions of grammar, spelling and syntax.
- 3. Use APA style for citations and references. (APA style guide is in the Pilgrim Library and there are plenty of resources on-line.)
- 4. PROOF your final copy, including spell check.
- □ **STEP 3** Submit a draft of your proposal to the McMaster Fellow with whom you will work for his/her review.

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PART ONE

• Project Abstract:

Provide a clear and concise summary of your project (max 200 words) that includes the following information.

- (1) the problem/ issue being addressed by your project;
- (2) a brief description of what you are proposing to do;
- (3) the community partner who will be involved with your project;
- (4) the expected outcome of your project.

• Project Rationale:

Explain why your project is important to the community you will be working with.

(1) Clearly articulate the expressed community need.

PART TWO

Literature Review:

- (1)Provide a context for your project that clearly evidences that you conducted *preliminary* research relative to
 - (a) the location of the project;
 - (b) the disciplinary focus of the project.
- (2)Define the problem being addressed and include
 - (a) an overview of scholarly literature relative to the problem;
 - (b) a description of how your project could impact the problem.

NOTE: Include a bibliography and appropriate documentation of all resources.

Methodology:

- (1) Describe what you intend to do
 - (a) pre-trip to prepare for the on-site implementation of your project;
 - (b) on-site specifically how you foresee your project being implemented on the ground and identify the community partners you will be working with;
 - (c) post trip including any analysis, product creation, or reflection.
- (2) Provide a preliminary budget specifically relative to equipment, materials, printing, translation fees, etc. that you will need to implement your project. DO NOT include travel costs.

• Project Outcome:

- (1) Provide a description of the final product, report, workshop, training, etc. that will be provided to the community partner.
- (2) Provide information that would help the reviewer to understand the identified potential impact that this project would have on the community.

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PART THREE

Goals

- (1) Explain how this project contributes to your academic, personal and professional goals.
- (2) Describe what you expect to learn and gain from this experience.

• Skills and Expertise

(1) Provide information about your skills, coursework, training, experience and expertise as they relate to your ability to do the project.

References: (Use attached Reference Forms)

Provide to the McMaster Office 3 complete references – *one each from*

- (1) the McMaster Fellow you will be working with if you are accepted as a McMaster Scholar
- (2) a professor in your major/discipline
- (3) a faculty, staff, or administrator at Defiance College, or any other individual qualified to comment on your suitability for this project.

References must be submitted by the Fellow, Professor, Faculty, Staff or Administrator in sealed envelopes.

- (1) the application submitted;
- (2) the priority and logistical feasibility of the project; and
