- How to temper economic interests with a focus on social justice

Student presenters are highly encouraged.
All proposals should include the following information:

- Format of individual paper, roundtable discussion, or panel of three or more presenters
- Name, phone, and email of presenter (panel proposals to include contact information for all presenters)
- Title of presentation
- Presentation description of 300 words, to include reference to the disciplinary perspective(s) involved
- Program abstract of 75 words
- Biography of 75 words for each presenter
