## McMaster Fellow

Steven A. Bare, Ph.D., Assistant Professor of History – This McMaster project focused on the historical research surrounding the Worthington Cemetery, a non-extant African American cemetery in Defiance County, Ohio. In partnership with the Defiance Public Library, scholars on this team collected historical data, including, but not limited to, documents, cadaver dog findings, and ground penetrating radar results. These findings were used to compose an application for a state of Ohio historical marker to be placed at the cemetery site. As of May 2023, the application has been submitted to the State Historic Preservation Office and the application is awaiting determination.
